BUT FIRST?!

WHAT IS AN ARTIFACT? IT IS ANY OBJECT MADE BY A HUMAN BEING, TYPICALLY AN ITEM OF CULTURAL OR HISTORICAL INTEREST.

SOME EXAMPLES OF ARTIFACTS ON THE PUEBLO INCLUDE CERAMICS (POTTERY SHERDS), PROJECTILE POINTS (ARROWHEADS), BONE TOOLS, ORNAMENTS, OR WORKED STONES.









THE BEST WAY TO PROTECT & PRESERVE ARTIFACTS IS TO LOOK & LEAVE THEM AS YOU FOUND THEM.

<u>BUT IT IS TO THE</u> <u>DISCRETION OF THE</u> <u>PERSON TO PICK IT UP.</u>

USE THE CATCH & RELEASE METHOD!

CATCH: HANDLING ARTIFACTS BY GENTLY HOLDING OR FEELING IS A GOOD WAY TO RESPECT THESE ITEMS. <u>RELEASE:</u> PUT THE ARTIFACT BACK WHERE IT WAS FOUND.





On May 13, community seniors/elders gathered at the Department of Natural Resources flower beds, we cleaned and planted. After planting we played a trivia game on environmental issues and enjoyed a light snack. Thank you to the seniors/elders who participated, it was a fun!

DNR participated in "Tamaya Summer Bash" on May 18. The children took pictures in DNR's wildlife photo booth cut out, colored pictures with information on the water cycle and water pollution. The children also received a rock, lizard, or hydro kit for explaining their colored picture.

May 23, DNR - Water Resources gave a presentation to the Kellogg Foundation on Santa Ana's 21-year-old program SAYH2O. The presentation gave an overview of the program's benefits, and it's influences on Tamaya youth to engage in wildlife and range management, geospatial information systems (GIS), environmental, conservation and water resources.

Tamaya Plant of the Month

Abronia fragrans, also known as snowball sand-verbena, fragrant sand-verbena, or prairie snowball, is a native perennial forb in the four o'clock family (Nyctaginaceae). It's common across much of the western US, including northern Mexico, and is typically found growing on sandy soils. Although it's a perennial forb, it dies back to ground level annually, only to reemerge in spring from its tap root—the tap root has been used in various traditional ways by indigenous communities in the Southwest, including to treat sores, calm stomachs, or as a food additive.

By mid-spring, the resurrected, blooming plants dot the landscape with conspicuous "snowballs." The "snowballs" are made up of many white tubular flowers growing outward from the ends of stems, in the shape of a sphere. The flowers are closed during the day, but open in the evening, and stay open until the next morning—hence its four o'clock family namesake. To a very small human looking up beneath a plant with many flower clusters, it might resemble the grand finale at a fireworks show. Regardless of your preferred scale to observe this plant, now is the time to see it, as it is in full bloom.

On Tamaya, look for it wherever it is sandy. It should be easily spotted along HW550, the road to the old village, or along the levy paralleling the river-side drain. If you're out in the early evening or morning, you might even be able to detect its fragrance, too.

Everyone jumped into several of the Conservation trucks and were escorted by the officers to Tamaya Kwii Kie Nii Puu. They scouted for special soils and clays for their pottery needs. For many of the community members it was the first time visiting the area. It was sunny day without any clouds and no wind!

DNR Director Doug McKenna, stated, "I learned a lot about types of clays, dirt colors, and soils needed to make this special pottery. There is so much work that goes into making these pots." Conservation Officers (COs) Bill Woody and Nathan Garcia, with THPO Tom Armijo, drove the members into some rugged country and hiked up and down hills, scouting for this special clay. "We really enjoyed getting to know everyone," claimed CO Woody. CO Garcia just smiled and pointed to other possible sites!

One member commented, "This place is so big, it would take years to see it all." Everyone is planning the next trip, into a different remote section of Tamaya Kwii Kie Nii Puu.




