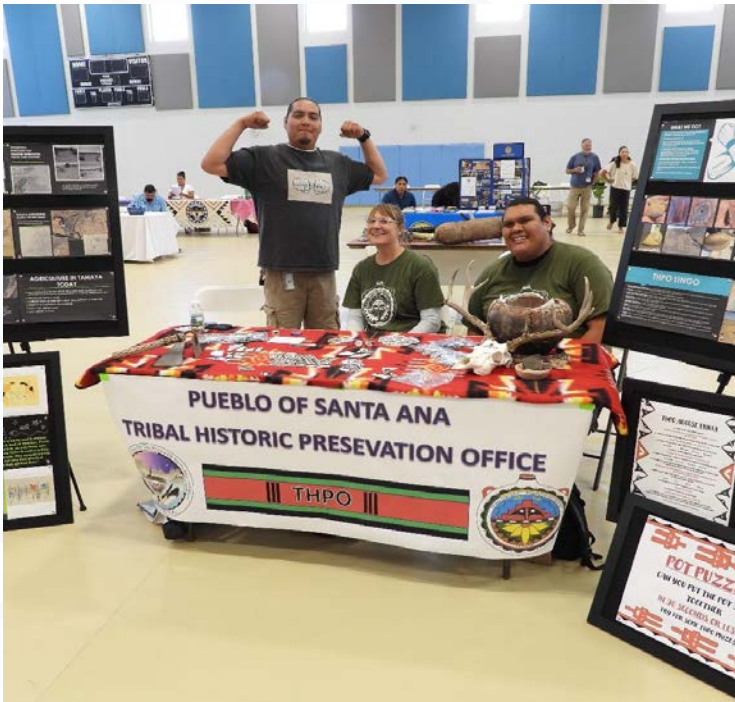

SANTA ANA AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISE 2024 GRAPE HARVEST

September 2023 Edition

August 7, 2024. Santa Ana Agricultural Enterprises (SAAE) vineyard production began its mechanical grape harvest. The evening August weather was perfect for harvesting grapes and the Santa Ana vineyard crew were prepped and ready to bring in its annual harvest. The grape harvest began with mechanical picking of the pinot meunière, pinot noir, and chardonnay. The brix level (sugar content) was at the prime level of 17 PPM needed for making sparkling wine. The grapes were harvested and shipped to Gruet winery out of Albuquerque NM. The crew worked three entire nights from 6:00 PM to 2:00 AM in the morning. Walter Dods, *vineyard manager*, lead the crew of eight employees alongside the outside harvester, Noisy Water Winery out of Ruidoso, NM who provided their mechanical harvesting equipment.



The vineyard at Santa Ana provides 3 varieties of grapes; Pinot Meunier, Pinot Noir, and Chardonnay. Gruet winery out of Albuquerque, NM uses Santa Anna grapes to make a specialized sparkling wine. Currently, Santa Ana vineyard is the only grape producer in the surrounding area that provides New Mexico grown grapes for Gruet winery's production. This year Santa Ana vineyard contracted with Noisy Water Winery out of Ruidoso, New Mexico to mechanically harvest the grapes. Jasper Riddle, owner, extended his appreciation to Santa Ana Pueblo and their vineyard production. Please read an article from the Albuquerque Journal about the SAAE grape harvest, (link provided below). The Santa Ana vineyard crew did in an outstanding job throughout the entire year to cultivated, grow, and harvest grapes. The Santa Ana vineyard crew is already preparing for the new 2025 crop.

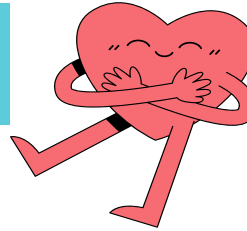

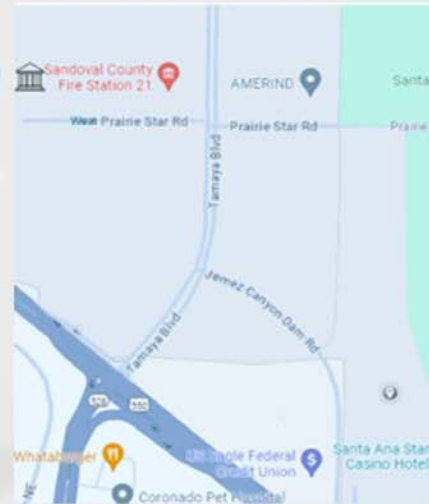

NEWSLETTER RELEASE

One of the responsibilities of the Santa Ana Tribal Police Department is Traffic Safety. Santa Ana and other communities have experienced needless suffering, pain, and loss because of motor vehicle crashes and related incidences. All too often this is due to neglect or the lack of attention of the driver. No one wants to hear of a loved one or friend being hurt or worse because of an avoidable traffic crash.

Santa Ana Tribal Police is participating in grant funded traffic safety activities and enforcement. Operation Buckle Up focuses on seatbelt and child restraint compliance. ENDWI deploys officers to target DWI enforcement through saturation patrols and checkpoints. STEP (Selective Traffic Enforcement Program) emphasizes police enforcement of a variety of traffic laws which statically causes or increases severity of traffic crashes. These programs are currently being conducted by SAPD and enforcement will be directed at all hazardous traffic violations.

Our goal is to enhance the safety for all our community members and visitors in Santa Ana. Please help us help you, wear your seatbelts, watch your speed, and obey traffic laws.
