Recycling Update!

The newly purchased cardboard baler is now up and running! This machine will be used to compress recycled cardboard into dense cardboard bales, which will require less space than unbaled cardboard and will save money when transported. Ultimately, this change will increase our capacity to process recyclable materials as we look to reduce the amount of waste that gets sent to the landfill.

Wildlife Corridor Summit



On 19 September 2024, the Pueblo hosted a Wildlife Corridors Summit in the Tribal Council chambers. The purpose of the summit was to inform the tribal and traditional leadership, and community members, about the purpose and mechanics of wildlife corridors, and about their related importance to cultural preservation in Indian Country.

The summit opened with a warm welcoming by Governor Myron Armijo and NM Department of Transportation Cabinet Secretary, Ricky Serna, followed by a half day of presentations given by Wildlands Network, Wildlife Connectivity Institute, Arizona Game and Fish Department, ARC Solutions, Native American Fish and Wildlife Society, Southern Ute Indian Tribe, and the Pueblo of Santa Ana Department of Natural Resources. The presentations focused on the justification and purpose of corridors, the mechanics of how corridors work, current corridor work across the US—including Indian Country—and information on the Sandia-Jemez Mountain Corridor, which runs across HW550 and I-25 on Tamaya. The presentations were followed by a meaningful question, answer, and discussion session.

In all, approximately 50 people attended the summit, including representatives from the Pueblos of Cochiti and Santo Domingo, NM Department of Game and Fish, and NM Department of Transportation. The summit concluded with a traditional lunch that included green chile, bone, and red chile stews, potato salad, and oven bread.

We thank all that attended for your support, and hope you learned a little bit more about wildlife corridors. If you missed it, be on the lookout for similar events in the future, you won't want to miss the green chile stew!



Food Waste

Hello Tamaya,
 Recently at the Environmental Fair you were asked to answer a question by the NM Recycling Coalition, below are the answers that were received.



Since vegetables seem to be the highest waste, here are helpful some tips!

SAVE MORE THAN FOOD
MAKE A DIFFERENCE

VEGETABLE STORAGE TIPS

- 1 Don't wash vegetables until ready to use.
- 2 Most vegetables do best in the high humidity drawer of the fridge.
- 3 Many limp veggies revive in a 10 minute ice water soak.

FOOD	STORE IT	FREEZE IT	REVIVE/USE IT UP
 Broccoli	Refrigerate in a breathable cloth bag or open plastic bag in the high humidity drawer.	Wash and separate into florets. Blanch, bathe in ice water, and dry. Freeze on a baking sheet, then store in an airtight container.	Stalks are tasty fresh, cooked, or grated into a slaw. Peel outer tough skin though.
 Carrots	Refrigerate whole carrots in a breathable bag, and cut carrots in water.	Wash, blanch, cool, chop or purée, and pack into an airtight container. Raw shredded carrots can be frozen without cooking.	Peel or cut away bruised, brown, or damaged bits and use the rest in soups, stews, and stocks. Use tops like herbs or in floral arrangements.

RADON TESTING KITS AVAILABLE!

- Radon is an odorless and invisible radioactive gas naturally released from rocks, soil, and water.
- Radon can get trapped inside homes and buildings, and build up in the air.
- Over time, breathing in high levels of radon can cause lung cancer.

There is no safe level of radon. You should always aim to have the lowest level. The US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recommends fixing your home if radon levels are 4 picoCuries per liter of air (pCi/L) or higher.

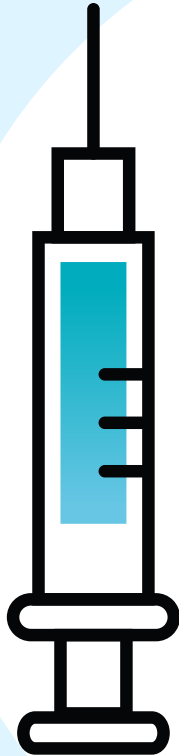

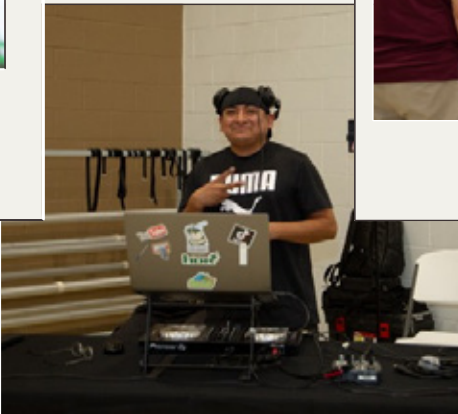
